

Fox & Barrel White & Rosé wines

Clean, fresh and zingy

Terre Cortesi, Marche Bianco. Italy

Apples & limes on the palate, crisp and clean finish. A simple and easy drinking white.

Esperanza, Sauvignon Blanc. Argentina

A fresh and zesty Sauvignon with concentrated aromas of mango, pineapple and limes.

Chemin Des Dames. France

We are constantly asked for a medium white and at last we have found one! An intense bouquet of peach and apricot flavours with hints of grapefruit and a touch of honey. Delicious.

Escarment Pinot Gris. Martinborough, New Zealand

NZ comes up trumps with this pear & tropical fruit driven white. It has a clean, fruity start which leads on to a crisp finish. A great alternative to Chardonnay or Sauvignon.

Pinot Grigio delle Venezie, Sentito. Italy

Textbook wine. Clean, fresh & dry with a hit of green apples and pears, touch of minerality.

Frascati Superiore, Cantine San Marco. Italy

Understated, yet very elegant, this wine has a light golden hue with soft fruity aromas.

Like all things Italian it is charming and elegant. Bellissimo!

Vavasour, Sauvignon Blanc. New Zealand

Dream Bay that occupied this spot was one of our finest wines, this has topped it! Bronze Medal from Decanter, it epitomises what Sauvignon is about. Clean, fresh, zingy, vibrant and that lovely gooseberry nose. Cloudy Bay look out.

Medium bodied with fruitiness

Tin Roof, Chardonnay. Australia

A soft, buttery Chardonnay, hints of apples with a smooth mouthfeel and a rich fruity finish.

Alto Pampas, Viognier. Mendoza, Argentina

Very ripe apricots are the lead nose here. Loads of sunshine gives a full and flavoursome body to the wine. Viognier at this price is a steal!

Bottle Tree, Semillon / Chardonnay. Australia

Produced at the edge of the Outback, this is a lovely example of a blend that really works.

Honeysuckle and lemons, lead on to a fresh fruity finish.

Wither Hills, Chardonnay. New Zealand

The Kiwis may be known for their Sauvignons, but this Chardonnay packs a weighty punch.

White peaches, hint of cashew nuts and big oak flavours. You want it large, this is it!

Gewurztraminer Cave de Turckheim. France

Put aside any prejudices and give this wine a go. Intense and floral on the nose, yet the finish is sharp and aromatic. Perfect with spicy foods.

Elegant and interesting

Picpoul de Pinet. Languedoc, France

Not dissimilar in style to a Muscadet, this lively southern French number is the perfect partner to anything fishy. Clean and invigorating it slips down a treat.

Canonbah Bridge, Verdhelo. Australia

Full on fruit, gentle acidity with a touch of raisins in the finish. We liked this straight away, even more when we found out that the winemaker married a local girl from Bunbury!

Gruner Veltliner - Domane Wachau. Austria

A wonderfully refreshing white from Austria's principle grape variety. Crisp, fresh and spicy with a delicious white flower and cracked pepper edge.

Macon-Vergisson, La Roche, Nadine et Maurice Guerrin. France

Wow, we really like this one. Burgundy, punching well above its weight. Good bit of minerality, with a touch of yeastiness. If this were Chablis, you would be paying double!

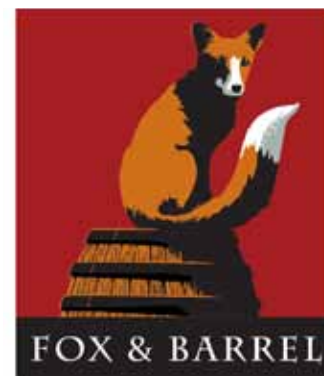

Chablis 'La Sereine'- La Chablisienne. France

Classically elegant - steely, minerally and flinty. This is what Chablis is all about. Enjoy it. 28.00

Greco di Tufo, Loggia della Serra. Italy

Italy, inland from Naples. Greco is the grape which gives a smoky almond aroma, the flavours are of sugary grapefruits. This is a big, grown up wine. 30.00

Rosé

Rosaspina. Italy

What you want in a rose, clean summer fruits, nose of strawberries, hint of sweetness and very easy to drink! This has it in bucket loads. 3.20 17.75

Chateau du Galoupet. Cotes de Provence. France

The benchmark rosé producing area. This is Cru Classe wine. The nose is soft and floral, the palate of cherries and raspberries leads to an elegant and fruity finish. Absolutely stunning! 26.00

Champagne

House Champagne - Baron de Beaupre

As with most fizz, this is a blend of Chardonnay & Pinot Noir. The finish is creamy and biscuity with lingering bubbles. Terrific value for money. 35.00

Taittinger Rosé

Classy Champagne house. Their wines are highly regarded around the world. The pink is sublime, a hint of blackcurrant with an elegant softness in the finish. A charming fizz. 55.00

Bollinger - Special Cuvée

Grande Marque Champagne, which owes a lot to AbFab for keeping its name in the spotlight. 'Bolly' is a truly consistent fizz, using 80% of previous Grand Crus in the making of the wine. 50.00

Dom Perignon

Possibly the world's best known Champagne. From the Moet stable comes this prestigious label. An effervescent wine of a golden hue with glints of silver and green and very delicate, numerous and vivacious bubbles that form an unbroken ring in the glass, that's the blurb, all we know is that it is OUTSTANDING and expensive! 120.00

Dessert wine

Chateau Dereszla - Tokaji 2000. Hungary

One of the worlds greatest sweet white wines. Picked berry by berry, it has intense fresh fruit aromas with a full hit of honey at the end. This is Heaven in miniature! (18.5cl) 17.50

Fine wine selection

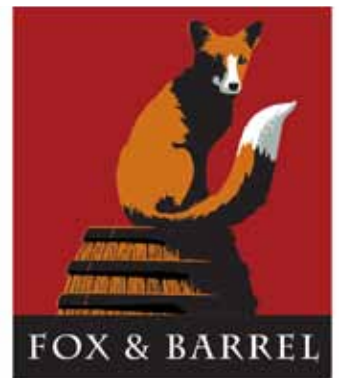
Pouilly Fuisse, Vieille Vignes 2006. Chateau de Fuisse

The flagship wine from the iconic producer of Pouilly Fuisse. Low yielding chardonnay, with massive hits of minerality, naturally creamy fruit and a hint of smoke & oak. Well balanced with a pronounced lengthy finish. 47.50

Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru "Morgeot". 2000

One of the worlds best known names for classic French wines. It is rich and intense with glorious stone fruit characteristics with an aroma of toasted brioche. This leads to an uplifting yet elegant and stylish finish. A wine to try before you die! 47.50

Malbec. Argentina

Great blend which gives a full, meaty yet rounded wine with a touch of plums and leather.

Roaring Meg, Mt Difficulty - Pinot Noir. New Zealand

We have been searching for this style right from day one. Soft, graceful tannins, leading with a sweet berry start. From NZ top area, Central Otago, it deserves its premium price.

Medium bodied and stylish

Rayun Carmenere, Central Valley. Chile

The variety is an old French one, but is grown at altitude, which gives the wine a hint of green capsicum juiciness. Soft and mellow, great everyday drinking.

Aresti Merlot, Curico Valley. Chile

Merlot needs to be soft & jammy with a little bit of spice. There should be a hint of chocolate and it should linger smoothly on the tongue. This has all of them and more!

Terra de Lobos Castelao, Cabernet Sauvignon. Portugal

Portugal has not featured before with us, however as a wine of the month, it was a surprise hit. Loads of fruit, bit of oak and above all else, immensely drinkable!

A highly concentrated wine with lots of blue and blackberry fruits, leaving you with a lovely silky smooth mouthful of wine.

Protocolo. Spain

Tempranillo, the grape of Rioja, that's what this is. Tasted it and put it straight on the list! All boxes ticked, fruity, hint of oak bit of vanilla. Just what the Doctor ordered.

At last, an entry level Rioja with some spirit! Deep, bright red cherry colour with a persistent aroma of ripe fruit and red berries. Superb lengthy finish.

There are always cherries and blackcurrants In Italian reds, this is no exception.		
It also has spent 12 months in oak, which gives a nice warming depth to the finish. Great value red.		21.00

Classic red from France. This one is still quite young, yet it is showing all the right depths of fruit married to some earthy herby flavours. Very enjoyable.		21.00
Reserva. Spain		
Rioja. As expected, a soft luxurious wine with a brambly nose and a hint of meatiness.		
Hints of warm leather and autumn fruit. Excellent balance and a lingering finish. Olé!		26.50
Canonbah Bridge S G M. Australia		
Shiraz, Grenache & Mourvedre - The Holy Trinity! Spice, big on fruits, softness with a hit of oak.		
In France this is Rhone of the highest order, in Oz it is a truly bonzer bottle of wine.		28.50
Rosso di Montalcino 2005. Italy		
100% Sangiovese. What you get is fresh forest fruits with depth and length balanced with a bit of 'grip' on the finish. What you also get is a fantastic wine to accompany red meat.		28.50
Nebbiolo d'Alba DOC, Eugenio Bocchino. Italy		
This is Barolo, except it grows just outside the classification. This means you get all the voluptuous fruit driven flavours ,without having to pay the top end prices! A staggeringly superb Italian.		
Check out the label - the family breeds dachshunds!		34.00
Chateauneuf-du-Pape, Domaine Lucien Barrot		
This is a powerful, yet softly structured Châteauneuf. Juicy blackcurrant and blueberry flavours fill the mouth with aromas of leather, smoke and Asian spices fill the nostrils. Good heady stuff!		34.00
Fine wine selection		
Chateau Sansonnet. Saint Emilion Grand Cru		
Visited this vineyard less than a mile from St Emilion itself in May 2007, what a cracking set up.		
The wine is rich, decadent with aromas of meat and fruit. Full bodied with a plummy finish.		
Robert Parker scored it 88, I just think it's stonking!		47.50
Volnay 1er Cru 2001. Domaine Blain Gagnard		
Elegance and power are the main elements of this classic Volnay. As with all Pinot Noir wines, red berries dominate the senses, in this case they lead you to an aroma of toasted caramel overlaid with fresh raspberries. A very charming red.		47.50
Vosne Romanee 2001. Domaine David Duband		
Earthy, deep, vegetal, black cherry and blackberry, herbal and robust. These all sound like an advert for the Body Shop! However, they are in fact the characteristics of David Duband's traditionally made bio-dynamic Burgundy.		47.50
